An Infant school enables children to take responsibilities in and around school e.g. being on the school council, being a playground or lunchtime buddy. In primary schools these are usually left to children in Key stage two. Your child will have opportunities to take a full part in assemblies, Christmas plays and music events which in a primary school would often be for older children.

Christmas plays, PTA events and parent and carer assemblies are built around the interests of younger children.
